
STUDYING IN GERMANY Regional Information

for Refugees in Potsdam-Mittelmark



Introduction

There are several possibilities to gain more education, even if your status as an asylum seeker is not official yet, and even if you did not manage to bring original papers and certificates from your home country.

This brochure is-providing you with brief answers to the most important questions you might have. There is many more detailed information (also in English) that can be found on the web. In addition to this basic information it might be useful to do some supplementary web research.

Online University

First to mention there is the Kiron University offering high quality online courses (e.g. in cooperation with Yale University) for the first two years. After successfully finishing the online classes you can change to one of the

15 co-operating Universities in whole Germany. To enroll the online-courses you don't need certificates, papers or language proofs.

On the platform www.integration.oncampus.de you will find a selection of offered online courses that are completely free of charge for your certificates. You can work on the courses in your own time. As there is no course mentor available, they cannot issue any certificates.

However, if you want to enroll in one of the supervised courses and get a certificate, please feel free to contact the oncampus team.

If you are looking for another simple way to attend courses, get in contact with students and teaching staff and thus participate in university life becoming a guest auditor.

Guest Auditor

As a guest auditor you can attend individual courses offered by the faculties. In some Universities the number of lectures you can choose are limited. In most Universities you can obtain a certificate of attendance for the classes you visit.

As a guest auditor you are not enrolled in a standard course of study. You do not receive the status of student. As a guest auditor you do not have to prove that you are entitled to access higher education nor that you have knowledge of German. Sometimes you have to pay charges to participate as a guest auditor, but especially for refugees the lectures are often free of charges.

E.g. the University of Potsdam has an extra status for refugees who want to study: they are so called "free movers". Free movers are more than guest auditors. They even can get credit points for a later following regular enrollment, they could use the entire infrastructure of the university and they are also supported with German classes.

Regular Student

To enroll as a regular student there are usually needed certain documents and a proof of knowledge of the German language (except for courses of study in English and art classes). Further you should be entitled to be granted asylum.

Usually the universities demand the following papers and certificates:

- Your high school diploma that entitles you to study in your home country.
- Certificates and grade transcripts from your former university if you have already studied.
- Proof that you know the German language.

Some universities co-operate with uni-assist e.V., a work and service point for international student applications in Berlin. So sometimes you will be asked to send your application to uni-assist e.V. . They will forward the reviewed papers to the university where you apply.

If, for political reasons, you are unable to submit certificates entitling you to access higher education, e.g. because you were unable to bring these to Germany, some Universities can, after assessing your individual case, offer you the opportunity to sit a placement test at the university to verify your level of education and your entitlement to access higher education. But you always have to submit a certificate attesting your knowledge of the German language, which is a study requirement in almost every case.

How to find the right degree program and the right university?

There are different types of higher education institution in Germany, offering different qualifications and career paths¹.

- universities
- universities of applied science (Fachhochschulen)/colleges
- technical colleges
- music and art colleges
- teacher training colleges
- business management schools

All in all, there are more than 17.000 classes and programs to study. So it will take a while to find the most suitable programme for your individual needs and preferences.

On www.study-in.de under "plan your studies" you will find a comfortable search engine for a huge database with study programs.

On www.daad.de you will find a data base for international programs (see "international programs")

or veterinary medicine, you do not apply directly to a certain university. The places in universities for medical studies are allocated by www.hochschulstart.de.

Application Process

To enroll as a regular student, you will need official documents, that proof your knowledge and education. If you apply for a certain university it is always a good idea to talk to somebody personally to find out if the documents you have are okay – or in case not, what exactly is missing.

Some universities offer the opportunity to sit a placement test at the university to verify your level of education and your entitlement to access higher education. So do not hesitate to ask the contact person.

The most important documents you will need to apply for a German university are the following:

- Your school report from your home country which proves your qualification for university enrollement (Hochschulzugangsberechtigung)
- If you were a student before, the reports and the grades of the courses you have taken

Universities request a proof of your knowledge of German language on a rather high level. The requested level is not always the same, depending on the university, course of study, and weather you start as a beginner or want to continue your studies on a higher level. So once again it is useful to ask the contact person of the university you apply for.

Certificates of Attendance of German language courses are not considered sufficient.

At least the **B1/B2**, better C1 level is necessary to be accepted for **STUDIENKOLLEG**

The **Studienkollegs** function as a "bridge" to help you adjust from the academic culture in your home country to the academic culture in Germany. In order to do this they offer courses specifically tailored to international university applicants. The teachers at the Studienkollegs, your "bridge builders", are highly qualified and specialised experts, who will work together with you.

You should approve your German language skills during your "Studienkolleg". At the end of "Studienkolleg" you should be able to pass the DSH Test.

Please note: not all universities offer a "Studienkolleg".

In some Universities you have the possibility to take this DSH-Language Test with at **least C1 level** independent from participating in a "Studienkolleg". Please ask your contact person!

The **DSH-Level** (DSH means "Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang") is **required to enroll directly** to a degree programme in a German university.

Other equivalent language levels/exams that are accepted in most universities are:

- **Test-DaF** (German as a Foreign Language) at least 4th level in every section
- Goethe-Zertifikat C2: GDS

- Deutsches Sprachdiplom der Kultusministerkonferenz

- 2nd level

PLEASE NOTE:

It is absolutely necessary to send your application documents as a certified/legally attested copy and to make a German or English translation which has to be certified as well!

Details about application procedure with "uniassist e.V."

Applications for Freie Universität, Humboldt Universität, Martin Luther Universität (and others in Germany) have to be handed in by UNI-ASSIST

But what exactely is uni-assist? uni-assist means: Arbeitsund Servicestelle für ausländische Studienbewerbungen. They will process all applications from international students for numerous German universities.

Application deadlines usually:

For bachelor degrees and state examinations: winter semester: **June 30** (deadline for handing in missing

documents: July 09)

summer semester: January 15

For master degrees:

winter semester: **April 30** (later applications are possible) exception: **March 31** for Pharmaceutical Biotechnology!

summer semester: October 31

But to be on the safe side please see application details of the degree program you apply for! Admittance is only granted if your documents are sent complete and by the set deadline to uni-assist and you fulfill the necessary requirements. We highly recommend that you send your application six weeks before the deadline. This way uni-assist e.V. has time to respond and ask you to hand in any missing documents.

How do you apply at uni-assist?

Please use the online application procedure at www.uniassist.de. Furthermore, please remember to send all documents through mail AND the printed out and signed online form as well!

A complete application includes:

- Your school report from your home country which proves your qualification for university entrance (Hochschulzugangsberechtigung)
- If you were a student before, please send your reports and the grades of the courses you have taken
- Certificate of German language, except for applicants for English-speaking degree programs and music (see "details about application documents and language proof")

It is once again necessary to send your application documents as a certified/legally attested copy and to

make a German or English translation which has to be certified as well!

Application fee:

An application with uni-assist costs 75 Euros for your first university choice.

All applicants pay 15 Euros for further university choices.

Certified Translations (in Berlin)

There are numerous translation offices, that offer certified translations from any language into German. Just google the name of your city (or the next major city) and "certified translation".

Please be aware, that you have to pay for certified translations. The costs depend on the number of pages you want to get translated.

The costs for a certified translation of a typical final school report are between at least $50 \in \text{up to } 130 \in$

To find out the specific costs, it might be useful to send your documents as PDFs to the translation office and ask for your individual estimation of costs.

Please note: Arabic interpreters are very busy these days, so please order your translations in time. It might take a little longer.

Legally attested copies of your documents

If you have got your certified translated documents, you will need to make certified/legally attested copies. The

legally attested copies can be made e.g. in Bad Belzig at the "Bürgerbüro" (citizens advice bureau) in the town-hall.

You have to **be registered in the city** if you want to make the legal attest! Sometimes, the copies are -for educational reasons only (e.g. application for universities)-free of any charge, otherwise they will be charged with a low fee (between 2-5 € each copy).

Bad Belzig: Opening hours "Bürgerbüro" (groundfloor/town hall): Monday, Wednesday, Saturday: 9:00 -12:00 (am) Tuesday, Thursday: 9:00 (am) - 6:00 (pm), Friday: 9:00 (am) - 4:00 (pm)

In **Brück** you can make your legally attested copies at the "Standesamt" (town hall). Opening hours "Standesamt" Brück:

Tuesday: 9-12 a.m. and 1-6 p.m.; Thursday: 9-12 a.m. and 1-4 p.m.

In **Brandenburg an der Havel** the "Bürgerservice", Nikolai Platz 30, is responsible for legally attested copies. Here you have to pay 2,50€ for each copy. Opening hours: Monday 9-11:30a.m. and 12:30-3p.m. Tuesday: 9-11:30 a.m. 2-6 p.m. Thursday: 8-11:30 a.m. and 1-3 p.m. Friday: 8-12 a.m. Every 2nd and 4th Saturday

8-12 a.m.

In **Beelitz**. copies can be made in the Town Hall (Pass-und Meldeangelegenheiten, Herr Brade, Frau Laue). Copies will be charged with 1,53 €-2,56 €, the legal attest with 2 €. Opening hours:

Monday: 9-12 a.m. and 1-3 p.m. Tuesday: 9-12 a.m. and 1-6 p.m. Thursday: 9-12 a.m. and 1-5 p.m

In **Michendorf** you will have to bring the original document AND a copy (e.g. from the copy shop). They will just do the legal attest, which is charged with $3 \in$. It will be done at the "Bürgerservice" in the town hall.

Opening hours: Tuesday: 9-12 a.m. and 1-6 p.m.; Thursday: 9-12 a.m. and 1-4 p.m. Friday: 9-12 a.m.

How to finance your university studies?

Studying in Germany – what does it cost?

If you study on a public university, your studies are generally free of charge. But every semester (twice a year) there will be a certain amount "Semesterbeitrag" (semester contributions, usually around 200 − 300 €) that has to be paid for administrational reasons and as a fee for the so called SEMESTERTICKET. This ticket enables students to use the entire public transport system of the city of the university and its surroundings. E.g. as a student enrolled in Berlin, your "Semesterticket" will be valid for whole Berlin.

Private institutions usually charge considerably higher fees. To (partly) finance a course, grants are awarded by the Government's support scheme for talented students (please google **Begabtenförderung**) and by several foundations.

Please be aware, that even the application process is associated with costs: For certified translations, service fees, paper and postage, travel costs for personal interviews, language courses etc. it can be easily added up to 200-500 €.

If you are enrolled as a regular student, you do not have requirements for payed housing nor do you get any other granted monthly financial support from the state. As a student you will be self-responsible for your subsistence. Besides the costs for food and housing you will also have to pay for your health insurance² (around $100 \, \text{€} / \text{month}$, depending on the specific health insurance). Depending in which city you live and study you should calculate with at least $600 - 1000 \, \text{€} / \text{month}$ ly costs for living and studying.

There are also possibilities to keep the costs little lower by e.g. living in a university housing or student's hall of residence (contact the "Studentenwerk" of your city and ask for "Studentenwohnheim"). But the situation for cheap housing in the most attractive cities like Munich, Cologne, Hamburg, Frankfurt/Main and even Berlin has developed in a very negative way. It might be a good idea to consider also smaller universities and cities as a place to live and study.

There are also several possibilities to find financial support. Besides BAFÖG, SCHOLARSHIP or SPECIAL FUNDS for foreign students in financial need, you can also ask for public housing assistance (usually at the "Wohngeldstelle or the "Bürgeramt" of the city you live in).

The possibilities are various. They could differ from town to town, from state to state and even universities might have their own social programs to support refugees. So finally it is highly recommended to talk to your contact person and ask him/her personally where you could find financial help

² To enroll you have to have a health insurance for students, so as soon as you have the acceptance of the university for your application you can contact one of the public health insurances (like Barmer, TKK, AOK etc.) or ask your contact person!

and support. Below you find a short description of the most popular ways to find financial support for students.

Financial support for your studies

BAFÖG

"Students can claim state training support (BaföG) if they fulfil certain conditions. A proportion of this must be paid back at the end of the training." ³

Starting from January 2015 there will be the possibility for refugees to request BAFÖG after being **at least 15 months in Germany**. BAFÖG is a financial help that is half sponsored by the government and half a student loan, that has to be paid back after studying.

SCHOLARSHIP

There are numerous scholarships you can apply for. Some scholarships are even reserved for refugees. It would go far beyond the scope of this basic information to list them all, so the listed scholarships are only the two most active programs. Please ask your contact person at the university of your choice about other programs that are suitable for you.

How to find a room?

In whole Germany it is **extremely difficult to find cheap housing these days**. As soon as you are enrolled in a university and have the official status as a student you can apply for a room/small apartment in a building for student housing. It is also difficult to find a room there, but at least these rooms can be afforded with a low budget. Ask your university about **a place in a "Studentenwohnheim"**.

Auditing Guest:

How to become a guest auditor?

You must submit an application to register as a guest auditor at the Department for Studies and Teaching (Abteilung Studium und Lehre). Once you have applied you will receive a guest auditor ID badge, this will entitle you to attend the classes you have registered for.

Which classes can be attended?

Guest auditors can attend any classes. You are only excluded from attending medical, dental, psychology and German classes. Admission as a guest auditor is subject to available training capacity. Therefore, the faculty in which you would like to attend a class is requested to give its consent.

To be accepted at the **Studienkolleg** you need:

- at least 500 hours of German lessons (level B1/B2) to be accepted for the entrance exam

To be allowed to take the DSH-test at Martin-Luther-University Halle-Wittenberg you need: - at least 800 hours of German lessons (C1)

To be admitted directly you need one of the following language certificates:

- Deutsche Sprachprüfung für den Hochschulzugang (DSH)
 Stufe 2
- Test-DaF (German as a Foreign Language) 4th level in every section
- Goethe-Zertifikat C2: GDS
- Deutsches Sprachdiplom der Kultusministerkonferenz 2nd level

What if documents could not be brought to Germany?

If, for political reasons, you are unable to submit certificates entitling you to access higher education, e.g. because you were unable to bring these to Germany,

Martin Luther University can, after assessing your individual case, offer you the opportunity to sit a placement test at the university to verify your level of education and your entitlement to access higher education. However, you must submit in every case a certificate attesting to your knowledge of the German language, which is a study requirement.

What if you don't have any of the mentioned certificates?

You can take the DSH intensive language course to prepare for the DSH exam at the University of Potsdam or take the DSH exam right away.

Whether you have to attend the intensive language course or proceed directly to the DSH exam will depend on the kind of language certificate that you already hold.

The University of Potsdam will send you an invitation to take the admissions test for the Intensive DSH German courses with propaedeutic components (Preparatory Courses for the German Language University Entrance Examination: DSH) if you

 are applying to study at the University of Potsdam through uni-assist e.V. (please select "DSH-Deutschkurs")

- have not yet been able to provide the necessary evidence of German language proficiency required for studying
- have a minimum of level B2 or <u>TestDaF</u> language certificate with a minimum of 12 points

If you pass the admissions test with very good results, you will be admitted to the Intensive DSH German course. This course takes place over the course of one semester and concludes with the DSH exam.

Refugees with a residence title and German language skills at least level B2 but without the requested documents, have the possibility to apply for the program: "Integration durch Studium – IdSUP". Within one year, you can sit tests that will be credited for your later studies. During this year you have time to organize your documents, while studying already. With this programme you are enrolled and considered as a regular student. You will get the "Semesterticket" and have to pay the Semesterbeitrag.
